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### THE PERSON OF THE MESSIAH - HUMANITY

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." John 1:14

### II. The Humanity of Christ in Scripture

■ 1 John 4:2-3 This is how you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Messiah has come in the flesh is from God, 3 but every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming; even now it is already in the world.

### A. Virgin Birth.

(Isaiah 7:14; Matt. 1:18-25; Luke 1:35, 3:23)

- **Isaiah 7:14** "Therefore, Yahweh himself will give you a sign: See, the virgin will conceive, have a son, and name him Immanuel."
- **Matthew 1:18** "The birth of Jesus Messiah came about this way: After his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, it was discovered before they came together that she was pregnant from the Holy Spirit."

- **Luke 1:35** "The angel replied to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God."
  - 1. The virgin birth made possible the uniting of full deity and full humanity in one person.
  - 2. The virgin birth made possible Christ's true humanity without inherited sin.

### B. Jesus Endured Human Weaknesses and Limitations

■ **Jesus Had a Human Body** (Luke 2:7, 40, 52; 23:46, 24:42; Matt. 4:2, 11; John 4:6, 19:28; 21:9, 13)

■ **Jesus Had A Human Mind** (Luke 2:52; Heb. 5:8; Mark 13:32)

- Jesus Had a Human Soul and Human Emotions (John 12:21, 27; 11:35; Heb. 5:7; Matt. 8:10)
- Jesus Was Understood by others to be a Human Being

(Matthew 13:53-58)

**Matthew 13:53–58** "When Jesus had finished these parables, he left there. 54 He went to his hometown and began to teach them in their synagogue, so that they were

astonished and said, "Where did this man get this wisdom and these miraculous powers? 55 Isn't this the carpenter's son? Isn't his mother called Mary, and his brothers James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas? 56 And his sisters, aren't they all with us? So where does he get all these things?" 57 And they were offended by him.

Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his hometown and in his household."

58 And he did not do many miracles there because of their unbelief."

## C. Jesus was Fully Human and Also Sinless

(2 Cor. 5:21; Heb. 4:15-16; 1 Peter 1:19; Acts 2:27; 3:14; 4:30; 7:52; 13:35)

- 2 Corinthians 5:21 He made the one who did not know sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
- **Hebrews 4:14–16** Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens—Jesus the Son of God—let us hold fast to our confession. 15 For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has been tempted in every way as we are, **yet without sin**. 16 Therefore, let us approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in time of need.

### APPLICATION: Worship Jesus Messiah as the God-Man

Athanasius (AD 373): "Such and so many are the Saviour's achievements that follow from His Incarnation, that to try to number them is like gazing at the open sea and trying to count the waves. For, indeed everything about it is marvelous, and wherever a man turns his gaze he sees the Godhead of the Word and is smitten with awe."\*

- Worship Jesus Messiah, our Sympathetic High Priest (Heb. 2:18; 4:15-16)
- Worship Jesus Messiah, the firstborn from the dead (Col. 1:18;
   1 Cor. 15:49)

- Worship Jesus Messiah, the God-Man forever (Luke 24:39ff; Acts 1:11; Rev. 1:13-17)
- Wayne Grudem: "The Incarnation is by far the most amazing miracle of the entire Bible—far more amazing than the resurrection and more amazing even than the creation of the universe. The fact that the infinite, omnipotent, eternal Son of God could become man and join himself to a human nature forever, so that infinite God became one person with finite man, will remain for eternity the most profound miracle and the most profound mystery in all the universe." †

# 1. The Messiah is our Penal Substitutionary Atoning Sacrifice

• The **Necessity** of Atonement (John 3:36, Eph 2:3, Heb 9:22, Rom 6:23)

- The **Nature** of the Atonement
  - **Penal** (Isa 53:5, 1 Pet 2:24)

    Tesus the Messiah paid the penalty of our sins...
  - Substitutionary (John 1:29, Isa 53:12, 2 Cor 5:21)
    ...by ding in our place on the cross...

• The **Results** of the Atonement

• **Propitiation** (Gal 3:13, Rom 3:23-25, 1 John 4:10) ...fully absorbing God's holy wrath...

• **Expiation** (John 1:29, Col 2:14) ... fully covering the guilt of our sin...

Purification / Positional Sanctification (1 Cor 6:11, 1 John 1:7, Heb 9:14)
 ... and fully cleansing us from the sin that separated us from God.
